Early arrival- Thur Sep 9	Tour on your own today and visit the beautiful ancient cities of Split & Trogir	Resnik Beach Hotel http://www.resnik-hotel.hr/ Visit Split's 1,700 year-old Diocletian's Palace which is one of the best preserved imperial palaces. Visit the Tribu club, with pool, dancing and lounge-style outdoor area.
Arrival Day Fri Sep 10	Tour on your own today and visit the beautiful ancient island of Trogir	In Trogir, find a small island that is less than an hour from Split. It is one of the most seductive towns on the Dalmatian coast with weathered Romanesque and Venetian-Gothic palaces, churches and monasteries. Meet for dinner and crew meeting at hotel. Small boat groups meet after dinner.
Sat Sep 11	Captains head to marina to check out boats while crew provisions and checks out of hotel. Board and prepare boats. Sail by lovely beaches as you approach Milne, Brac where we will overnight.	Visit the island's famous beaches, the dragon's cave or the famous Blaca desert.
Sun Sep 12	Sail to Hvar and spend time exploring and sampling local cuisine. A relaxing day to enjoy the sites and sounds of Croatia.	Rent a scooter and visit people who produce lavender & rosemary oils locally. Visit the Franciscan monastery, fortress and theater. Dinner ashore at Carpe Diem, one of the dalmatian islands best known venues and drink at the Veneranda club, set in hills above Hvar in an old Franciscan monastery.
Mon Sep13	Sail to Korcula and visit the old walled city and learn about Marco Polo and the tournament game between the Black and White kings.	Visit the Venetian palace with a loggia, take the 10-minute bus ride to Lumbarda for sandy beaches, enjoy a glass of Grk and dig into fresh grilled fish and octopus. Stroll through romantically lit Old Town after watching the sunset from the Tower cocktail bar.
Tue Sep14	Sail to Mljet the greenest and most tranquil of the Dalmatian islands. Enjoy a change as this island has dense vegetation and dark blue natural salt lakes.	Anchor in the bay and dinghy to shore. While there, enjoy a carriage ride to see the lovely town or head to one of the island's 2 salt lakes that are warmer than the ocean for a bath-like swim.
Wed Sep15	Sail to Vis. It has fantastic nature with numerous bays and beaches that offer peace and tranquility joined with traditional Croatian cuisine. Small home restaurants where you can eat in the home environment and try some local delicacies like lamb, weel, fresh fish, sheep and goat cheese and local wine.	Enjoy the unspoilt mountain scenery as you walk upon the donkey trails throughout the island. Vis has for centuries been famous for its wine and vineyards so enjoy the many local varieties in small restaurants and pubs In Vis town, try Pojoda or Villa Kaliopa restaurants.
Thu Sep16	Spend last night in Solta. – Free Time to Relax and Explore	In Sesula Bay, visit the Sismis ("The Bat") beach bar, who's nights have been renowned but not publicised amongst the locals, and yachties in the know. Try the local black olive tapenade- this pure olive spread comes exclusively from one island in the Adriatic - Solta.
Fri Sep 17	Sail to Trogiror Kastela to overnight in port where we will check boats in. Spend the night onboard and enjoy the local tavernas to celebrate our last night together.
